Regulation on the Special Admission Requirements and the Admission Procedure for the Bachelor Degree Program

International Business Studies

at the Jade University of Applied Sciences Wilhelmshaven/Oldenburg/Elsfleth

The Senate of the Jade University of Applied Sciences Wilhelmshaven / Oldenburg / Elsfleth on xx.xx.2021, in accordance with § 18 (6), (14) and in conjunction with § 51 (3) Lower Saxony University Act (NHG) of 26 February 2007 (Nds. GVBL. 69), last amended by Article 11 NHG of 10 December 2020 (Nds. GVBl. P. 477), decided on the following regulations:

§ 1 Scope and General Admission Requirements

- (1) These regulations regulate access and admission to the Bachelor's degree program "International Business Studies".
- (2) The admission requirements for the above-mentioned course of study are met by those who can prove the language skills specified in §§ 3 to 4 of these admission regulations, in addition to the generally applicable admission requirements according to § 18 Lower Saxony University Act (NHG).
- ¹Applicants with a foreign qualification recognized as equivalent must, notwithstanding the provisions from § 1 (4) of the university's enrollment regulations, prove sufficient knowledge of the German language at least at level A1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. ²Proof must be provided by submitting a recognized certificate or passing a language proficiency test carried out by the university. ³This can be submitted up until semester 2.

§ 2 Admission Process

- (1) If, in the event of admission restrictions for the degree program, there are more applicants that meet the entry requirements than there are available places, places are awarded according to the result of the university's own selection process. For the allocation of study places, a ranking list is created on basis of the final grade of the university entrance qualification certificate. If, according to the grade so determined, individual applicants are of equal rank, the ranking on the list is determined by lot.
- (2) The general provisions of the university's enrollment regulations for admission and enrollment remain otherwise unaffected.

§ 3 Special admission requirements (foreign language skills)

- (1) Applicants for studies must provide a suitable school certificate for university admission to prove that they have English language skills in accordance with the European Framework of Reference for Languages level B2.
- ¹If the certificate according to paragraph 1 above cannot be submitted, the following proof of English language skills is possible:

- a) Certificate for passing an official language test at the European Framework of Reference for Languages level B2.
- b) Successfully completed vocational language training in English (foreign language correspondent, foreign language assistant).
- c) Proof of an English-language school graduation certificate for university admission or an English-language university qualification.
- ²The dean of studies or the examination committee determines the respective valid language tests for sentence 2 a).
- (3) The dean of studies or the examination committee can, upon request, admit other evidence than those specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 if these are suitable to prove English language skills in accordance with paragraph 1.
- (4) The relevant proof that the language admission requirements have been met must be submitted by the applicants with the application.

§ 4 Special admission requirements (language test)

If the prerequisites according to § 3 cannot be supported by evidence, a language test can be carried out at the request of the applicant by the dean of studies or an entity commissioned by the dean of studies, with which the applicant provides evidence of adequate language skills.

§ 5 Start of Studies

The study program starts each winter semester.

§ 6 Enforceability

These admission regulations come into force after approval by the Ministry of Science and Culture of Lower Saxony on the day after publication in the public announcements of the Jade University and apply for the first time to admissions for the winter semester 2021/22.
